In addition to his column, he writes the nationally syndicated comic strip "Gil Thorp," about a high school coach and the ever-changing cast of kids at Milford High School.

His last stop before Detroit was Las Vegas, where he was a three-time state sportswriter of the year in an admittedly limited field. A Michigander since 1984, Rubin grew up in Southern California and Colorado and attended the University of Northern Colorado on a 7-card stud scholarship. He prefers dogs to cats, game shows to reality shows, and writing to actual work.



Lucas Wittmann will serve as the guest host for **Blaine Harden** on April 9. Wittmann is the Literary Editor and Senior Articles Editor at *Newsweek* and *The Daily Beast*. He oversees the National Magazine Award-winning Book Beast, a leading online book section. Prior to the Beast, he worked in publishing at W.W. Norton & Company.
