

J. BAIME'S first book Go Like Hell: Ford, Ferrari, and their Battle for Speed and Glory at Le Mans, is currently in development for a major motion picture by 20th Century Fox, starring Tom Cruise and Brad Pitt. Baime is a regular contributor to the Wall Street Journal and an editor-at-large at Playboy.

In Baime's latest book Arsenal of Democracy: FDR, Detroit, and an Epic Quest to Arm an America at War, the Ford Motor Company

and its production of the B-24 Liberator heavy World War II." bomber take center stage. He focuses on Ford's



B-24 bomber plant outside Detroit in Willow Run, where for the first time engineers attempted to mass-produce airplanes the way they did cars.

It's an engrossing story that Baime described as an opportunity to "tell a rich story about the most important collective achievement of any city

in the nation's history, and that's Detroit during World War II."

OFFMAN is an award-winning journalist who has spent two decades covering major companies in the automotive, technology and biotechnology industries. His new book

American Icon was a Wall Street Journal bestseller that the paper named one of the best business books of 2012.

At the end of 2008 Ford Motor Company was in the fight of its life but when Congress threw it a taxpayer lifeline Ford ignored it.

Instead, the iconic company under the leadership of Alan Mulally, pulled off one of the biggest comebacks in business history. It would become one of the great management narratives of our time. While the rest of Detroit collapsed, Ford went from the brink of bankruptcy to being the most profitable automaker in the world.

From his front row seat as the Ford beat reporter for the Detroit News, Hoffman conducted hundreds of interviews and gleaned topsecret documents, memos and archives to craft compelling narrative nonfiction that reads like a high stakes drama.

How Detroit helped save a world at war, and how in turn an iconic company saved itself.



he National Writers Series and Traverse City Public Schools launched Front Street Writers, tuition free creative writing intensive for Grand Traverse area high school students in 2012.

Throughout the year the Front Street Writers program also conducts free and low cost writing workshops for individuals ages seven to adult.

OPHIE Kinsella wrote her first novel under her real name, Madeleine Wickham, at the tender Uage of 24, while working as a financial journalist.


The Tennis Party was immediately hailed as a success by critics and the public alike and became a top ten bestseller. She went on to publish six more novels as Madeleine Wickham.

She submitted her first Kinsella' novel 'Sophie anonymously to her existing publishers and it was snapped up without her editors knowing that she was already one of their authors. It wasn't until the appropriately titled Can You

Keep a Secret? was published that Sophie revealed her true identity for the first time.

Kinsella raced onto the UK bestseller lists in September 2000 with her first novel in the Shopaholic series — The Secret Dreamworld of a Shopaholic (also published as Confessions of a Shopaholic). The book's heroine, Becky Bloomwood - a fun and feisty financial journalist who loves shopping but is hopeless with money - captured the hearts of readers worldwide and she has since been featured in five further adventures.

Kinsella is also the author of five stand-alone



novels and Confessions of a Shopaholic was made into a movie starring Hugh Dancy and Isla Fisher.

Her latest Shopaholic novel Shopaholic to the Stars, starring Becky Bloomwood is set in Hollywood.

Kinsella was born in London. She studied music at New College, Oxford, but after a year switched to Politics,

Philosophy and Economics. She now lives in London, UK, with her husband and family.



RITA MAE BROWN November 6, 2014 Farmer, Feminist & Feline Fan

T'S NO SECRET that Rita Mae Brown prefers

the company of animals to people, a penchant that is reflected in her work. From her memoirs, to her Mrs. Murphy mysteries (co-authored by her cat Sneaky Pie) and her series of Sister Jane fox hunting thrillers, Brown is a tried and true animal lover.

She is also a gay rights activist and feminist pioneer as well as a prolific author. Brown's first novel *Rubyfruit Jungle* written in 1973, about growing up a lesbian in America and living happily ever after was an unprecedented blockbuster. She

was an early member of the National Organization of Women (NOW) but was thrown out after a fallout concerning the group's homophobia.

Brown has published nearly a book a year since the 1970s. She has written novels, essays, screenplays, volumes of poetry, cookbooks, a memoir, and most famously, mysteries. She worked with Norman Lear on several TV shows, winning an Emmy, and has written some 40 books, many of them bestsellers. She even became a tabloid star during her three-year relationship with tennis su-







perstar Martina Navratilova.

Her latest book, *Let Sleeping Dogs Lie* is a gripping new foxhunting mystery, featuring the irrepressible "Sister" Jane Arnold and the wily antics of her four-legged friends. In this book a century-old crime reawakens bad will—and stirs up a scandal that chills Sister to the bone. It's a rollicking, riveting mystery full of

colorful characters, gorgeous country landscapes, and the breathtaking thrill of the hunt.

Brown lives on a farm in Afton, Virginia with a slew of cats and dogs, a stable of horses, and a pack of foxhounds.

Always funny. Sometimes Outrageous. The New York Times bestselling author and literary icon makes a rare appearance in Traverse City.


fingers in her hotel room.

A conversation with BRIAN CASTNER and BRIAN TURNER NOVEMBER 19, 2014 THE STORY OF WAR, THE LANGUAGE OF BEING HUMAN

RIAN Castner served as an Explosive Ordnance


Disposal officer in the US Air Force from 1999 to 2007, deploying to Iraq to command bomb disposal units in Balad and Kirkuk in 2005 and 2006. He and his team disrupted roadside improvised explosive devices, investigated the aftermath of car bombs, and searched house-tohouse to find bomb makers. After leaving the active military, he became a consultant and contractor, training soldiers and Marines prior

to their tours in Iraq and Afghanistan. When Castner returned home and was alone with nothing but his thoughts, he couldn't put the war aside and move on.

In his book *The Long Walk: A Story of War and the Life That Follows*, he examines his struggles with confronting the new person who returned home.

"The first thing you should know about me is

RIAN Turner, a pre-eminent American poet, served for seven years in the U.S. Army. He was deployed to Bosnia-Herzegovina in 1999-2000 with the 10th Mountain Division. Then in November 2003 he was an infantry team leader for a year in Iraq with the 3rd Stryker Brigade Combat Team, 2nd Infantry Division.






that I'm Crazy," he writes. And so begins *The Long Walk*, an unapologetic memoir that alternates between the terror, excitement and camaraderie of combat, and the lonely battle against the fear, anxiety and survivor guilt once he returns home to his family. *The Long Walk* received an Ama-

zon Best Book of 2012 and Chautauqua Scientific & Literary Circle selection for 2013. His writing has appeared in a number of national and regional publications, including *Wired, The New York Times, The Daily Beast, The Wall Street Journal, Newsweek, Foreign Policy,* and Garry Trudeau's *The Sandbox* anthology. Castner lives outside of Buffalo, New York with his wife and four sons.


In 2003, Turner crossed the line of departure with a convoy of soldiers headed into the Iraqi desert. Now he lies awake each night beside his sleeping wife, imagining himself as a drone aircraft, hovering over the terrains of Bosnia and Vietnam, Iraq and Northern Ireland, the killing fields of Cambodia and the death camps of Europe. MY LIFE d3 d FOREIGN COUNTRY d Means A Mean In his memoir *My Life as a Foreign Country*, Turner, also an award-winning poet, retraces his war experience—pre-deployment to combat zone, homecoming to aftermath. Turner also sees through the eyes of the enemy, imagining his way into the experience of the "other." Through it all, he paints a devastating portrait of what it means to be a soldier and a human being.

His first book, Here, Bullet, chronicles his time in Iraq. His poetry and essays have been published in The New York Times, National Geographic, Poetry Daily, The Georgia Review, Virginia Quarterly Review and other journals. Turner was featured in the documentary film "Operation Homecoming: Writing the Wartime Experience," which was nominated for an Academy Award. He received a USA Hillcrest Fellowship in Literature, an NEA Literature Fellowship in Poetry, the Amy Lowell Traveling Fellowship, a US-Japan Friendship Commission Fellowship, the Poets' Prize, and a Fellowship from the Lannan Foundation. His most recent book of poetry, Phantom Noise, was short-listed for the T.S. Eliot Prize in England. His work has appeared on National Public Radio, BBC, Newshour with Jim Lehrer, Here and Now, and on Weekend America, among others. Turner is the director of the MFA program at Sierra Nevada College and the prize-winning author of two poetry collections about his years in the U.S. Army. He is also the author of the acclaimed poem



"The Hurt Locker." He serves as a contributing editor at The Normal School. He is married and lives in Orlando, Florida.

Three veterans of the war in the Middle East, all acclaimed authors, come together on the NWS stage to tell their stories as literature and as a record of an epochal event.

BENJAMIN Busch is the author of the award-winning memoir *Dust* to *Dust* and a regular contributor to *Harper's Magazine*. Ben lives in Reed City, MI, with his wife, historian Tracy Busch, and two young daughters.
