WELCOME TO THE NWS 2021 VIRTUAL AUTHOR SEASON

Welcome to the story.

Which story? you ask. Your story, our story, the stories guest authors bring with them when they come to the National Writers Series. Who are we? Where are we? I think of Henry David Thoreau's 1848 essay "Ktaadn."

The first time I read it, I felt, as Emily Dickinson said one would feel in the presence of a poem, that the top of the head had been taken off, not of course in any permanent way, so to speak, but the way that Art can do – to stun, amaze, change, delight, entertain.

Here's Thoreau:

"On the 31st of August, 1846, I left Concord in Massachusetts for Bangor and the backwoods of Maine, by way of the railroad and steamboat... I proposed to make excursions to Mount Ktaadn, the second highest mountain in New England..."

He goes on for several exhilarating pages, passing through a "wild" place of "wind, rocks & trees," until finally, he writes—and this is the part, because it seems so surprising, electric, inevitable—coming out of nowhere:

"What is it to be admitted to a museum, to see a myriad of particular things, compared with being shown some star's surface, some hard matter in its home! I stand in awe of my body, this matter to which I am

bound has become so strange to me. I fear not spirits, ghosts, of which I am one,—that my body might,—but I fear bodies, I tremble to meet them. What is this Titan that has possession of me? Talk of mysteries! Think of our life in nature,—daily to be shown matter, to come in contact with it,—rocks, trees, wind on our cheeks! the solid earth! the actual world! the common sense! Contact! Contact! Who are we? Where are we?"

These seem like good questions.

Questions that novels and nonfiction books and young adult novels and graphic novels and the conversations we have onstage at NWS try to answer. Journeys up and down the mountain. As we gather and talk about the story at hand.

We're so glad you're here. Thanks for sticking with us through this past year. We need each other. Need the stories, the ones that say, *Here we are*.

NWS LITERARY JOURNAL



COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

n partnership with the Grand Traverse Regional Community Foundation, NWS has awarded 38 students with \$56,000 in scholarship money.

The winning pieces are published in the NWS Literary Journal each spring.

ach year, we host poetry workshops with Traverse Heights and Blair elementary school fourth and fifth graders. We believe in the power of poetry to help young people find their voices and express themselves creatively.



BATTLE OF THE BOOKS

aunched in 2016, Battle of the Books Grand Traverse is a free, book-based trivia competition. Dozens of teams read books provided by NWS and then compete before judges to show what they know. This program has become wildly popular, filling up even in a virtual pandemic year with more than 350 students.

Battle of the Books is a huge endeavor, made possible with a partnership with the Traverse Area District Library, dedicated volunteers, generous sponsors, and the leadership of program coordinator Marcy Lindberg.

More than 350 kids and 62 teams participated—a record year!—and it was so fun to see all the costumes, cheers, and secret hand signals the kids had devised to make our Zoom battles fun.


ROBIN WALL KIMMERER

s a botanist, Robin Wall Kimmerer has been trained to ask questions of nature with the tools of science. As a member of

the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, she embraces the notion that plants and animals are our oldest teachers. In Braiding Sweetgrass: Indigenous Wisdom, Scientific Knowledge and the Teachings of Plants, Kimmerer



brings these two lenses of knowledge together to take us on "a journey that is every bit as mythic as it is scientific, as sacred as it is historical, as clever as it is wise" (Elizabeth Gilbert).

Braiding Sweetgrass weaves together a central argument: that the awakening of a wider ecological consciousness requires the acknowledgment and celebration of our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world.

This special ticketed event is presented in partnership with For Love of Water (FLOW), a nonprofit dedicated to protecting and preserving the Great Lakes. Half of the proceeds from our ticket sales will go to FLOW to support their mission.





After receiving his J.D. from George Washington University, he joined New York City Teaching Fellows. He is the founding Executive Director of After-School All-Stars in New York and New Jersey, and was the winner of the National Association of Black Journalists' Investigative Reporting Award. Currently he is a fellow at Type Media Center.

In his latest book, Letters to My White Male Friends, Ross speaks directly to the millions of people who are suddenly awakening to the ways racism warps us all. Ross helps readers understand what it meant to be America's first generation raised after the civil rights era. He explains how we were all educated with colorblind narratives and symbols that typically, albeit implicitly, privileged whiteness and denigrated Blackness. He provides the context and color of his own experiences in white schools so that readers can revisit moments in their lives where racism was in the room even when they didn't see it enter. Ross shows how learning to see the harm that racism did to him, and forgiving himself, gave him the empathy to see the harm it does to white people as well.

Ultimately, Ross offers direction so that we can take just action in the workplace, community, family, and, most importantly, in ourselves,



especially in the future when race is no longer in the spotlight.

egan Miranda V is the New York Times bestselling author of All the Missing Girls, The Perfect Stranger, The Last House Guest, a Reese Witherspoon Book Club pick, and The Girl from Widow Hills. Miranda returns to the virtual stage with the National Writers Series after hosting our 2020 event with Ruth Ware. Such a Quiet Place is her riveting new suspense novel about a mysterious murder in an idyllic and close-knit neighborhood.

Hollow's Edge used to be a quiet place. A private and peaceful neighborhood where neighbors dropped in on neighbors, celebrated graduation and holiday parties together, and looked out for one another.

But then came the murder of Brandon and Fiona Truett. A year and a half later, Hollow's Edge is simmering. 

Ivy Lin is a thief and a liar-but you'd never know it by looking at her. Ivy's



immigrant grandmother relies on lvy's mild appearance for cover as she teaches her granddaughter how to pilfer items from yard sales and second-hand shops. Thieving allows lvy to accumulate the trappings of a suburban teen—and, most importantly, to attract the attention of Gideon Speyer, the golden boy of a wealthy political family. Susie Yang was born in China and came to the United States as a child. After receiving her doctorate of pharmacy from Rutgers, she launched a tech startup in San Francisco that has taught 20,000 people how to code. She has lived across the United States, Europe, and Asia.


JOHN U. BACON
